ORDER ON MOTION FOR A
PROTECTIVE ORDER

This matter is before the Court for consideration of a motion for a Protective Order and Entry of a Stipulation and Order. Dkt. # 129. The parties have a dispute over the language to be used in the Stipulation regarding continuing guarantees to be filed pursuant to Dkt. # 80. The parties were advised by the Clerk to present their respective proposals in the form of a Protective Order. Having considered both versions proposed by the parties, the Court now adopts the Joint Stipulation and Order drafted by defendant and appearing in the record as Exhibit I to the Declaration of Joshua Slavitt, Dkt. # 139. Although this stipulation does not contain certain language requested by plaintiff regarding the purposes for which the continuing guarantees can

1 be used, it does provide that the limitation as to purpose can be modified “upon further order of
2 the Court.” This represents a reasonable resolution.

3 Accordingly, plaintiff’s motion is GRANTED IN PART and DENIED IN PART. It is
4 hereby ORDERED that the parties shall file a signed stipulation in the form designated above,
5 and shall submit a copy for the judge’s signature, within a week of this date.
