CASCADE GREENLAND 3-D Cowl

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This stitch pattern is just a couple of ticks away from being an ordinary garter rib. But what a difference those couple of ticks make. Between the pattern and the yarn, this cowl is almost too cuddly to believe. And the fabric has so much depth that it almost seems three dimensional.

Materials: 2 100 gram skeins of Cascade 128 Greenland yarn. Pictured cowl is color #3518. Size 9 needles, 24 inch circular **or size required to obtain gauge.** Marker.

Gauge: 4 stitches per inch in stockinette. **BE SURE TO CHECK GAUGE!!**

Glossary:

T2R – K into front of 2nd st on lefthand needle, K 1st st and slip both sts off tog.

T2L – K into back of 2nd st on lefthand needle, K 1st st and slip both sts off tog.

DIRECTIONS:

Cast on 100 sts. Place marker and join in a circle being careful not to twist sts. Work 4 rows of K2, P2 ribbing. Move marker 1 st to the left. Begin pattern.

Pattern:

Row 1 – *T2L, T2R, rep from * to end of row.

Row 2 – P1, * K2, P2, rep from * to last 3 sts, K2, P1

Rows 3, 5 and 7 – K

Rows 4 and 6 – Repeat Row 2

Row 8 -- *T2R, T2L, rep from * to end of row.

Row 9, 11 and 13 – K1, *P2, K2, rep from * to last 3 sts, P2, K1,

Rows 10, 12 and 14 – K.

NOTE: This pattern will only work in the round. Do not use these directions to knit something back and forth. In order to get this look in a flat garment, the row repeat must be either 12 or 16.

Repeat rows 1 to 14 five times or to desired depth. (Pictured cowl is about 10-1/2 inches when cowl is slightly stretched.) Work row 1 only. Work 4 rows of K2, P2 ribbing.

Bind off loosely. Weave in all ends.
