Uses Cascade 220

#8393 Navy

#2401 Burgundy

#8509 Gray

## Houndstooth Jacket

Uses Cascade

#8555 Black

#8400 Gray

Basketweave Jacket

#1089 Dark and Medium Gray

Slipping Stitches with the yarn on the RS of the fabric adds a truly woven appearance, especially in a 2-or-3 color marled yarn.”
