



**Two-Toed Sock (W125)
Using Cascade Fixation Pattern**

Materials:

2 balls of Fixation for main color
1 ball of Fixation for contrast color

Size 4 double pointed needles
About 12" of waste yarn

Sizes: Child/ Women/ Men

With main color, cast on 48 sts. for child size/ 60 sts. for women/ 64 sts. for men. For a well supported, snug top, work k2, p2 rib for 4 rows or longer. Arrange sts.: place ½ of the sts. on 1 needle and split the remaining sts. between 2 needles. Work in pattern (either st. st. or rib) for 4"/ 6"/ 7". Work waste yarn on the needle holding ½ the sts. Go back and pick up main color and knit over waste yarn sts. Continue knitting a tube until it measures 3"/ 4"/ 6" from waste yarn.

TOE:

With contrast color and starting with the needle that is holding ½ the sts. work as follows:

Round 1. K1, sl 1, k1, pssso, k to the last 3 sts. on needle, k2tog, k2, sl 1, k1, pssso, k to last 3 sts of the row, k2 tog, k1.

Round 2. Knit all sts.

Repeat these 2 rounds until 16 sts. remain. Leave about a 12" tail and graft the sts. together.

HEEL:

Carefully remove the waste yarn and place ½ the sts. on 1 needle and the other ½ on the remaining 2 needles. Follow the pattern for the toe decreases leaving 20 sts. to be grafted together.
